PASTOR'S PAGE

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice." (Philippians 4:4NRSV). Some might ask the question, "How can we rejoice in our world today?" With the devastating crisis in Ukraine, the ongoing mass shootings, record high inflation (not to mention the price of gasoline), a country divided on many significant issues and a government that seems to be stalled on getting anything done, we can certainly be pessimistic about rejoicing.

Paul lived in difficult times as well, living through persecutions, imprisonments, shipwrecks (three of them) and scourged with 39 lashes (five times). The world around Paul suffered as well. The burning of Rome, ongoing persecutions of Christians, civil war in Rome, the cities of Pompeii and Herculaneum destroyed by the eruption of Mt. Vesuvius, the Jewish revolt against Rome that led to the fall of Jerusalem, the death of over a million Jews and the destruction of the Temple.

A close examination of history shows that every generation has had reasons to be skeptical about rejoicing. So in what do we rejoice? We rejoice in the Lord! The problems of our world are what we should be praying about. Praying that we will not only endure, but overcome as well.

Rejoicing in the Lord also opens us up to the opportunity to rejoice in other things as well. We can rejoice that our food pantry never closed during the pandemic, even offering more distribution days to help those affected by the closing of businesses. We can rejoice that there are vaccines available for Covid-19 and we are learning how to live with the virus. We can rejoice that we are back to worshipping in person. We can rejoice that for the first time since 2019, we had a public confirmation service at which five of our youth affirmed their faith in the Lord. We can rejoice that Christ died for our sins and promised us everlasting life in Him.

Regardless of the times that we face, the Lord has also blessed us with many good things and reasons to rejoice. But, first and foremost, we must rejoice in the Lord always.

I look forward to and rejoice that we will have our annual picnic this year. You may have forgotten the fact that the picnic was cancelled in both 2018 and 2019 due to bad weather conditions. I am hoping that we have both a great turnout and a great time. I also look forward to the return of Vacation Bible Camp (formerly School). I have missed the opportunity to interact with our youth during the pandemic.

Let us pray for God's help in the difficulties of our world and of our lives and rejoice in the blessings that He has given us, as we await the triumphant return of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

As Paul writes, ⁴ "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice." ⁵ Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶ Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:4-7 NRSV).

We all like to sing and members of the church like to hear you!

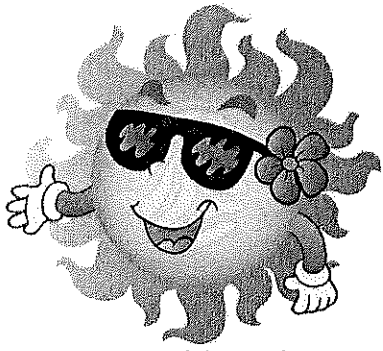
Vacation Bible Camp is July 18- July 22. You will want to come to that too and meet some new girls and boys.

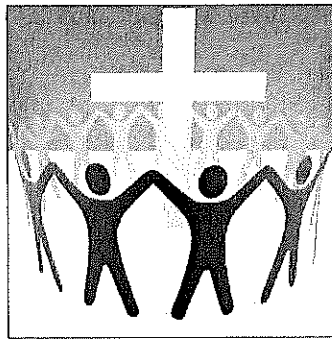

Spring 2022 Property Report

Greetings in Christ, It's been 7 months since our last report from November last year. A lot has happened since then with the church properties. Some of the issues and problems we dealt with were serious and needed to be addressed immediately others could be set aside temporarily. Property meets the first Saturday every month unless it's announced at another date along with additional days during the week for some of us who are available. We will try and put in chronological order starting with December of last year.

December 2021:

Painting continued in the lobby area

Fire code violations were corrected.

The new HVAC units have been installed and inspected by the Borough of Runnemede.

A new led ceiling light fixture was installed in Sanctuary stairwell.

A stainless steel cap was installed on top of the church chimney after it was cleaned.

January 2022:

The church was de-decorated after Epiphany, we have a new memorial light Christmas tree. The new tree is smaller and much easier to handle and all the lights work.

We have a contract with Independent Alarm Co. who installed a smoke and alarm detection system in 17 & 25 Knight Ave. houses. Zindell Electrical was hired to install the AC power for the new system.

February 2022:

A new sink, faucet, base cabinet, and counter top has been installed in the Sacristy which was done in house by property.

Our old boiler developed a serious leak and could not be repaired. A new boiler was able to be acquired and was installed by Anyzek Plumbing & Heating we were blessed to be able to get one. Many thanks go to Ed Anyzek and his men for what they did to get us a new boiler and installed in short time.

The new smoke alarm system was installed and inspected by the Borough and we are now in compliance with fire code regulations.

The carpet on the Altar was repaired by Simple Charm Flooring (under warranty).

We have a contract for Great Plumbers of Blackwood to install the new state mandate of a backflow preventer check valve for the incoming water supply for the church. This new device must be tested every year by a certified licensed plumber. We were able to have 17 and 25 Knight Exempt from the new mandate.

March 2022:

Painting was finished in the basement stairwell to Fellowship Hall.

New switches and receptacles were installed in the Greeting Room.

March 2022 continued

Painting continued in stairwell up to the second floor landing.

Ceiling tiles were replaced in the Johnson Ave. entrance.

New led lamps were installed in 2 light fixtures in the Greeting Area to match the other lights in the room.

The utility /oil tank room was cleaned, and organized.

April 2022:

The Greeting Area restroom was prepped and painted.

A Wi-Fi extender was purchased and installed in the serving hall to bring better Wi-Fi reception to the basement area including Fellowship Hall.

The double doors in Fellowship Hall are being repaired and painted.

Anyzek Plumbing & Heating completed repairs to the fresh water tank that supplies fresh water to the boiler.

Property met with Tim Veigel who is a mason, and repaired our back stairwell and ramp last year to give us an estimate to repoint our front steps and stained glass window in the front of the church in addition to sealing and caulking concrete areas around the steps.

May 2022:

Painting in the Greeting Area restroom is now complete.

Removed duplicator from secretary's office to the dumpster area for salvage.

Assembled 2 small podium tables for the Sanctuary.

Mounted a used flat screen TV in Fellowship Hall.

June 2022:

Started prepping and painting the kitchenette area.

Replaced 2 toilet seats with new one in the Greeting Area restroom and the other in the 3rd floor restroom.

Work continued on the double doors in Fellowship Hall.

This list compiles scheduled and unscheduled work, some items need immediate attention which takes away from some of the projects we like to work on.

In addition to the things mentioned we do routine monthly safety inspections and dozens of jobs too small to report. We also assist other ministries when asked.

It takes a lot of work and planning to keep our properties in good working order, and it would not be possible without the dedicated people who donate their time and talent every month, and this is true of all our ministries, unselfish dedication by our members to make our church function as a whole.

Our ministry in property is very rewarding, we work to maintain and improve our physical structures, have great fellowship, and a knowing that as Pat Henry said many times " May the Glory be to God"

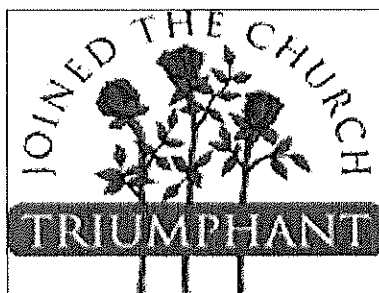

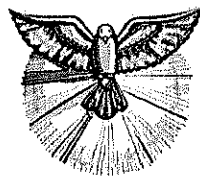

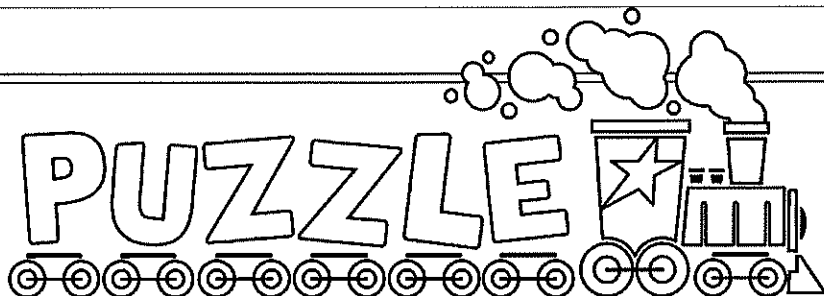
