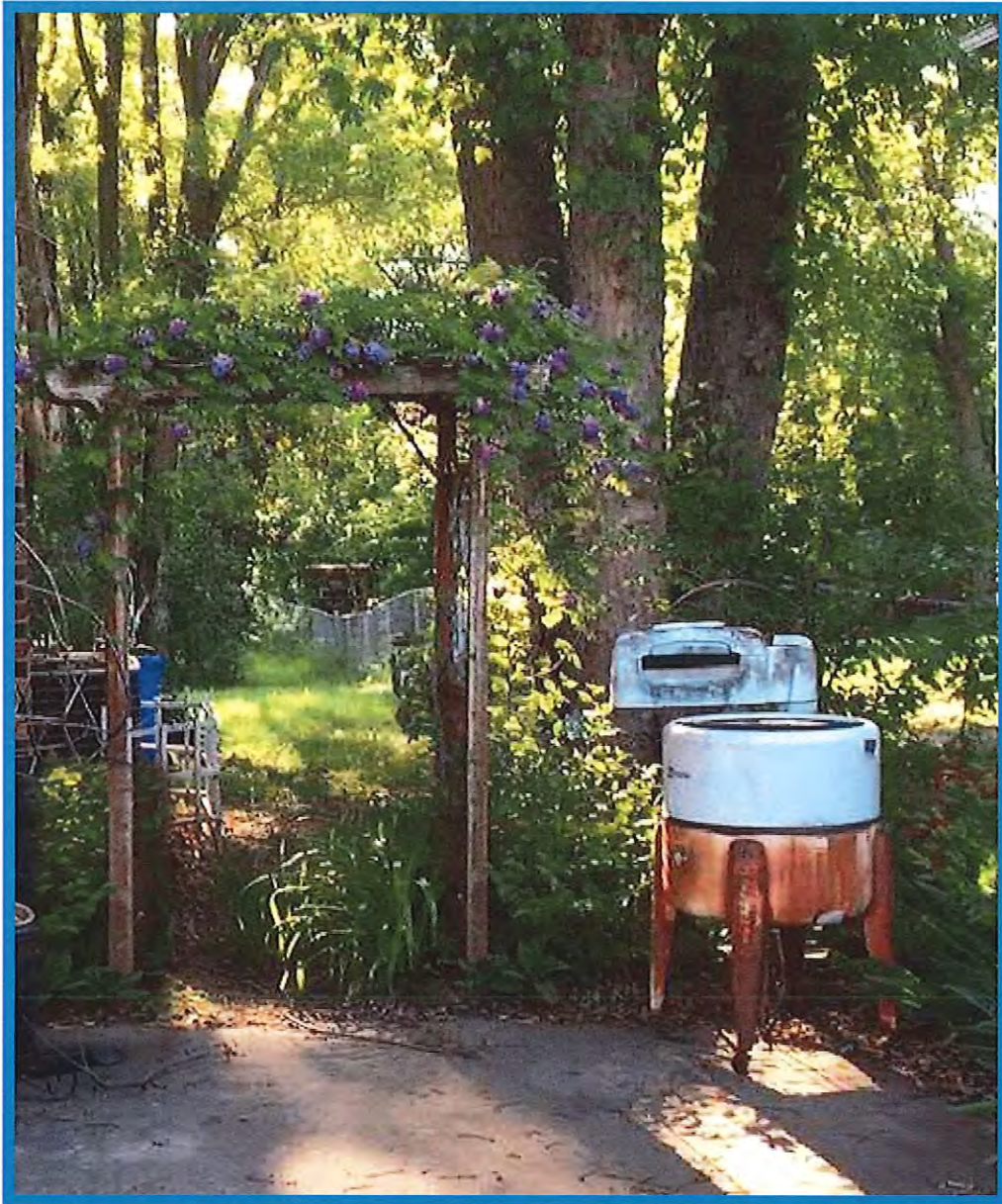

Welcome back to an exciting year for the Confirmation Class. Looks like we will have a large and exciting class this year. First class will start September 10, 2023.

Confirmation class is a two-year program, Seventh and Eighth grade or older. If you were in the Sixth Grade Class you will be automatically enrolled in the class. If you are new or haven't been out for a while, please let the church office know so we can make sure we have enough materials for the whole class. Students will be confirmed members of the church at the end of their second year at a special Confirmation ceremony, usually in the end of May. Confirmation does not meet during the summer months- June, July, and August. Attendance is very important and in conflicts, emergencies, sickness, absence will be allowed. Please let the teachers know.

We work out of a book called "Applying Luther's Catechism". It has five parts: The Ten Commandments, The Apostles Creed, The Lords Prayer, Confession and the Sacraments, and Confirmation and the Table of Duties. We break down each of these subjects and relate their meanings to today's life.

Students will also be required to do a sermon report every Sunday and parents are encouraged to attend with them. The students will also perform different duties around the church. They will be required to perform acolyte (lighting the candles) or crucifer (carrying the cross down the aisle, leading the choir and Pastor). They will also be performing different service projects for the church. They will be helping to serve at various breakfasts/luncheons.

Having met some of the students, we are really excited to work with them. I think their favorite trip is when Pastor Andy treats them to ice cream at the end of the year. They will also visit Gardner's Funeral Home.

We also want to thank their past Sunday School teachers for the excellent job they have done, preparing them for our class.

I am writing to thank you for the donation of gloves, hat and winter items —we appreciate you thinking of us and those that we serve.

It is as busy as ever here at the Kitchen as we get further into Spring. Guests continue to have a choice to eat in our welcoming, restaurant style dining room or take their meals to-go, and we serve an average of about 550 hot meals a day on site and out in the community. Every guest also receives a take home bag, put together daily by our volunteers, filled with sandwiches, snacks, and fruit. While here for a meal, guests also have access to an array of services provided in our Pavilion, such as case management, free groceries, and free hygiene items. Our various partners also offer services on site, providing help with health insurance, benefits applications, legal issues, health issues, and much more.

This month we were able to provide Easter baskets to the children of our guests and culinary training students. Various organizations in the area put together and donated the baskets, which were filled with fun goodies, treats, and toys. We are grateful to those who donated and the outpouring of support for the families we serve.

Lastly, our 29th Culinary Arts Training Class graduated from our program last week. All of the class passed the ServSafe exam, which certifies our students in safe food handling and makes graduates more marketable to employers in the culinary field. We are also recruiting for our 30th class, which will begin in May.

Everyone here at the Kitchen appreciates your donation, but more importantly, the many hundreds of people who eat and train at the Kitchen each day appreciate you too, even though they may never know you. **Thank you for your support.**

FALL PROPERTY REPORT 2023

Greetings in Christ from Dave and Rich. We Co-Chair the Property Committee here at Trinity. Property usually meet the first Saturday of the month at 8:00 am unless it falls on a holiday weekend or other circumstances that may arise such as a wedding or a funeral. Property manages a wide range of tasks from interviewing contractors for specific work that is better outsourced, to contract negotiations, routine maintenance, small to large projects, and any emergencies that may happen. We also assist other ministries that ask for our help. The committee consists of a small group of dedicated people who with their talents and efforts truly make a tremendous difference in the overall maintenance and appearance of the church. The committee reports directly to the Pastor and Council on all matters concerning our property and submits quarterly and an annual report at the November Congregational meeting. Our goal is to maintain Trinity's property in good working condition for our members and guests and try to work within our annual budget. The cost savings are substantial to the church's annual budget. Even though we have members with many talents in the ministry, you really do not need to have any special skills to participate. There are so many different tasks to do that with a little direction anyone can do. The workday's are not limited to just men, we have had quite few workdays in the past where the ladies came out and helped with some tasks, and were great. If you have a son or daughter or grandchildren in high school and are looking for credit time towards community service on their resume for college we can help with that. We have never ending tasks that are always in need of attention. (Yes, that's why God gives us work to do). The property committee is a fulfilling and rewarding ministry in the service to God and his church. If you have any questions about what we do please ask, we'll be happy to answer them.

Workday Updates

March:

1. The Radiator covers and heating pipes in the pantry closet were wire brushed and prime painted.
2. The light socket in the electrical panel room was replaced.
3. Fellowship Hall lighting has been completely re-lamped with new LED tubes.
4. The closet behind the Sanctuary was cleaned out and re-organized.
5. Routine inspection (1) emergency light needs replacement.

April:

1. Reset all timers to DST, replaced (2) burned out lamps in the brick sign in the front of the church.
2. The paneling behind Fellowship Hall was remounted back into place from the plumbing work that was done to the heater lines.
3. Routine emergency light testing no exceptions.
4. Work continued on the pantry closet.
5. The outside stairwells were swept clean.
6. The inside stairwell walls were cleaned of scuff marks.
7. Water-stained ceiling tiles were replaced in the Sanctuary and in the glass door entrance area.

FALL PROPERTY REPORT 2023

Updates Continued

May:

1. Routine emergency light testing no exceptions.
2. Trim work was started on the radiator covers in Fellowship Hall.
3. Some electrical work was done in the Hall.
4. Tim Veigel was hired to re-point the The Jesus stained glass window inside and out. He also re-pointed the Knight Ave. side entrance steps to the Sanctuary.

June:

1. Routine emergency light testing no exceptions.
2. Electrical work was done in the pantry closet.
3. The electrical service panel area and boiler room were vacuumed clean.
4. The first coat of finish paint was applied to half of Fellowship Hall.
5. The radiator covers have been built and will be painted white.

July:

1. Routine emergency light inspection no exceptions.
2. There was water intrusion in the choir room. Standing water was found in the choir room due to heavy rains in the area. It was determined the outside steps next to the room were the reason why. The steps were vacuumed cleaned and the drain at the bottom of the stairwell was cleaned of sand and debris. The steps were then caulked sealed from the bottom well to the landing, and along the foundation at ground level. We have had several heavy rains since with no evidence of any water.
3. The final coat of paint was applied to the walls of Fellowship Hall, also the first coat of trim paint was applied to the new radiator covers. French cleats were made to hang the new covers when completed.
4. Excess construction material was removed and some housecleaning in the adjacent room to the Hall was done
5. Fellowship Hall was cleaned and set up for VBS.
6. Picnic supplies were gathered and checked off for the church picnic.

August:

1. Routine emergency light inspection with (1) defect
2. The 2nd grade classroom on the 3rd floor will be reclassified to 5th & 6th grade, and the current 5th & 6th class will be relocated to their new room. The former 2nd grade classroom was prepped and painted. It will also have the trim painted white, new switches and outlets, and new ceiling lights.
3. Fellowship Hall: New 2ft. sample ceiling tiles were acquired to see if they will fit our existing ceiling grid for the conversion from a 2ft. X 4ft. ceiling panel to a 2ft. X 2ft. Ceiling.
4. VBS decorations were removed, and picnic supplies, and our 3 coolers were stored away.
5. The hall was broken down and cleared for continued work, but had to be re-set due to an unexpected event.

This is our latest update, and as you have read, we are quite busy keeping Trinity in good working order along with new improvements, and probably left out a few items. The committee has a dedicated crew and were always looking for new faces to join us for a little work and some good fellowship. Dave and I want to personally thank everyone who does come out on our workdays, without your dedication we could not accomplish our mission to keep Trinity a beautiful place to worship.

MINISTRY TO THE CONGREGATION

A part of the music program is the JUNIOR CHOIR made up of children in grades 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. The director of the Junior choir is Mrs. Schmidt. The accompanist is Mr. Kraemer, using both piano and organ. Mrs. Dilks is the church organist and may be accompanying us from time to time.

September will be the beginning for the members who will be starting Junior Choir. The children will be expected to be at the church every Sunday from 9:45 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. The children will be singing for the congregation for the first time on October 24th. This time gives the children and parents the opportunity to begin learning the songs, as well as each other.

Children will be in the Choir Room in the basement near the old fellowship room. Practicing lasts 15 minutes each week. (This is why we keep mentioning the importance of being here on time.) Please make a serious effort to be prompt; because when the session is over, you will go to your Sunday School classes.

Sunday School will start on Rally Day, September 10th. Every grade will have a special room to go to each week. While children are singing and going to their Sunday School lesson, parents will be able to sit in the church.

We will be trying robes to wear when we sing in church. (Parents, I will have washed them so you will know they are clean.) On Sundays the children sing in the church, they will go downstairs to the Choir Room to take off their robes. When finished, children will go to their own classes.

The Choir Room is used for Choir practice for Junior Choir members and for the Adult Choir members to get their robes and to go over their anthem each week.

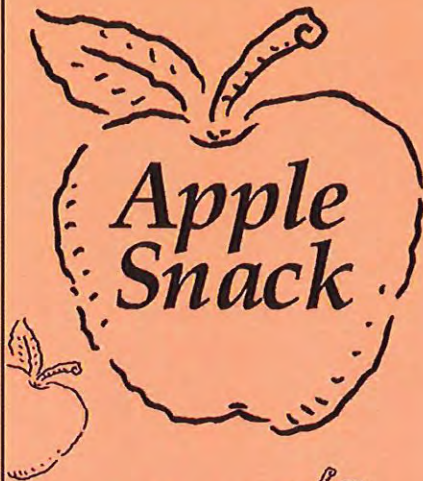

- lemon-lime soda

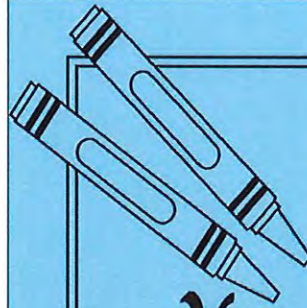
How to make:

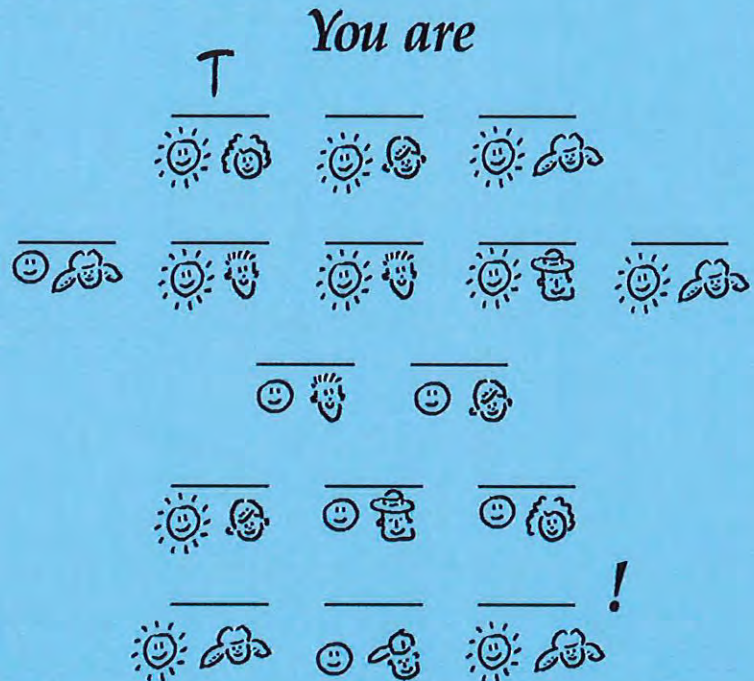
